The click of an unlocked door marks the beginning of another busy day at Fără Limite Climbing Gym. Chalk instantly covers hands, and clouds of chalk dust fill the air. Music blasts as kids scale the walls for the next seven hours. Cheers of encouragement and warm embraces provide a glimpse into the family they've built here, a stark contrast to many of the kids' lives outside the gym walls.

Felipe and Janelle work with Roma youth in the Jiu Valley to build trust, perseverance, character, and courage through rock climbing. In a town where poverty forces many parents to move for work, this ministry provides youth an environment where they can experience safety and respect, develop life skills, pursue education, and come to know the love of Christ. Felipe and Janelle have also planted Anchor Church, which is building a strong core of disciples and hosting a diverse education program five days a week.

COC-Christian Opportunity Center

Christian Opportunity Center (COC) is a public benefit corporation that supports more than 200 people with disabilities. COC prides itself on its caring and quality staff and its responsiveness to the needs and wants of the people it serves. For over 50 years, COC has been proving what's possible in the lives of people with disabilities. The mission of COC is "integrate Christian values in empowering individuals with disabilities to realize their full potential." Each person that we support has gifts and abilities unique to them. Our staff are focused on helping them both identify and develop those gifts and abilities and then with helping them use those skills to be active members of their communities. Types of skill building our staff assist with could be obtaining and keeping a job with a business in the community, opening and maintaining a bank account, accessing a local medical clinic for necessary medical services, or attending and participating in the life of a local church.

As our name and mission indicate, COC is a faith-based organization. Christian values of Honoring God, Commitment to Service, Responsible Stewardship, and Leadership Excellence inform how we do what we do every day. Our services are designed to address the needs of the whole person.

COC provides services and supports to people with disabilities in the communities of Pella, Oskaloosa, Knoxville, Indianola, and Des Moines. We offer services ranging from 24/7 residential, to weekday programs, to a few hours per month of vocational support.
